Wardrobe Guidelines

Provided below are guidelines for the wardrobe you will need to participate in the 2010 Miss Warner Robins Outstanding Teen Scholarship Pageant.

Interview

Contestants will not be allowed to wear suits. Instead of suits, the contestants should wear teen stylish clothing. The outfit should be reflective of her personality and age. She should look fresh, hip and young. More important, she should look like a teen.

Opening Number

Shorts, Capri's, pants, outfit that reflects the style and fun of the movie/musical "**Legally Blonde!**" Make sure your shoes are comfortable enough that you can dance in them. Use your imagination- she wore a lot of pink!

On-stage Question

You will be judged in your on-stage question wearing your interview outfit or Evening Wear-we will let you know when we find out how many contestants are in the pageant.

Talent

Wear something appropriate for your talent. The rules of good taste and **age appropriateness** should prevail. Remember that stage lights are strong and you need to make sure you have sufficient lining with any talent outfit. Props are discouraged unless absolutely necessary.

Sports Wear

Contestants will wear an outfit of their choice but perform the same modeling routine that will be taught during rehearsals. Model sportswear in character of your choosing that represents something you do to stay fit. No swimsuits. For example, cheerleaders can model their uniforms; if you play tennis, you can model your tennis outfit. This is a modeling routine and will be fun and fast-paced. If a prop is used (tennis racquet, pom poms, etc), it may not inhibit the judging in any way. Contestants can be creative without embellishments – no sequins, stone, beads, etc. In other words - no sparkle. This is not an extension of your talent competition.

Evening Wear

Contestants are allowed to wear any type of Evening Wear – pants, cocktail dresses, or the traditional gown. Shoes and jewelry should coordinate with the ensemble. Again, good taste and age appropriateness should dictate your choice.
